ROCK THE STREET, WALL STREET TAKES PART IN WHITE HOUSE CONFERENCE

NASHVILLE, Tenn., November 1, 2016 — Rock The Street, Wall Street (RTSWS) attended The White House Conference on Inclusive STEM Education on Oct. 28.

The White House Council on Women and Girls invited RTSWS to this conference for being a leader in the field of underrepresented populations in STEM: science, technology, engineering and math. RTSWS represents the M in STEM, aiming to get more girls financially literate and potentially pursue careers in finance.

"Access to STEM education is access to power. STEM professions are tools to lift you out of poverty," said Maura Cunningham, founder and executive director of RTSWS. "This conference reinforces our belief that students look to do what they see examples of, and Rock The Street, Wall Street offers them such examples. Our female financial professionals are role models who work in the M in STEM. We cannot move the needle on this issue without partnerships with industry leaders."

The National Math and Science Initiative and U.S. Department of Energy sponsored the conference. Other organizations in attendance include the U.S. Department of Education, the Council on Women and Girls, the American Association of University Women, the National Science Foundation, NASA, Intel, and Yahoo.

"Corporate diversity and inclusion (D&I) initiatives are supplemental and additive. These programs are optional and often exist to discuss important issues but with not enough impact to change the lives of women working in STEM. The number of women in the financial services pipeline and in leadership positions continues to stagnate," Cunningham explains. "We can't stay in our silos. Corporations aiming to get more women and minorities in the financial services industry must create a consortium or syndicate to increase their numbers."



The conference agenda consisted of a discussion on advocating for inclusive STEM, a talk series on exposure and access, attainment and retention, and breakout sessions.
