
We provide female financial professionals as instructors/ mentors as well as up to date, cutting edge curriculum. All you need to do is get the students to sign up and we do the rest.

THE BENEFITS OF OUR PROGRAM

Since launching in 2012, **over 6,000 students** have participated in our year long program; some have taken our series of courses, (green, silver, gold & bronze) over 3 out of their 4 years in high school. Our students show a **71% increase** in financial & investment knowledge and Also, **1 in 4** RTSWS alumnae pursue degrees or are in the profession of finance, economics or related business fields.

- Mentors serve a similar role as guidance counselors. They help students identify and then emphasize individual strengths, discuss college and career preparation, assist with resume preparation and LinkedIn profiles, mock interviews, and further develop positive money management habits.
